### III. MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES

#### A. DISTRICT MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD

See Section I.B. for a complete list of Board members, including contact information.

#### B. THE MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE AND THE DISTRICT STUDIES PROGRAM

##### 1. Eligibility

Participation in the Ministerial Development Initiative overseen by the District Ministerial Development Board (MDB) is required of all persons having a local minister's license (*Manual* para. 426.4) or district minister's license (*Manual* para. 427.1 and para. 428.1) who are members of the Intermountain District. Enrollment with the MDB Records Secretary is a condition of such participation.

##### 2. How to Enroll in the District Studies Program

A. Personal Preparation: Persons enrolling with the Ministerial Development Board will find it helpful to read pages 1-32 of the *Handbook for Christian Ministries*. A link to the *Handbook* may be found at our district website ([www.intermountaindistrict.org](http://www.intermountaindistrict.org)) or the denominational website ([www.nazarenepastor.org](http://www.nazarenepastor.org)).

B. Apply to Enroll: Concurrent with the granting of a local minister's license through the local church, the local minister should complete the Minister in Development Application to Enroll form and submit it to the MDB Records Coordinator (see Section I.B for contact information). This form is available on the district website ([www.intermountaindistrict.org](http://www.intermountaindistrict.org)) or from the District Office.

C. Pay \$10 Enrollment Fee: A check, made payable to the Intermountain District, should accompany the enrollment application. This is a one-time fee.

D. Send Official Transcripts: Official transcripts of all college/Bible school/seminary work should be sent to the MDB Records Coordinator at the Intermountain District Church of the Nazarene. These will be evaluated by the MDB Placement Coordinator in order to determine the progress of the Minister in Development (student) in the Course of Study and placement in a ministerial development tier.

##### 3. Upon Enrollment

Upon receipt and processing of the enrollment application, the enrollment fee, and official transcripts, the Minister in Development (MID) will receive from the MDB Records Coordinator a welcome letter, a Course of Study Student Record, information regarding the ministerial development tiers and the tier in which he or she has been placed, information and guidelines for completing the Supervised Ministry Experience, and any additional materials concerning current educational policy and opportunities.

##### 4. Educational Preparation

A. Educational Requirements: The Church of the Nazarene requires an approved/validated Course of Study consisting of 24 courses in order to fulfill the educational requirements for ordination. Ministerial students enrolled in a Nazarene institution of higher learning (such as Northwest Nazarene University) are advised during their educational program what courses will meet ordination requirements. Students attending non-Nazarene institutions of higher learning are encouraged to work closely with the Placement Coordinator to assure that the requirements of the course of study are completed.

B. Minimum Requirements: The *Manual* of the Church of the Nazarene requires that a minimum of two courses (modules) be completed per year. MIDs not completing the minimum course requirements are in danger of being placed in inactive status and eventually dropped from the course of study. MIDs must submit grade report forms or official transcripts to the Records Coordinator by February 15 (See "Reporting Requirements" below).

C. Evaluation of Progress: Regardless of the avenue of education preparation taken by the MID, the Placement Coordinator makes final determination with regard to all MIDs as to compliance with the educational requirements set forth in the *Manual* and the *Sourcebook for Ministerial Development*. The MDB Executive Committee shall have sole responsibility to rule in the event of an appeal by an MID of the determination of the Placement Coordinator.

D. Avenues of Preparation: The recommended avenue of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college or university and, if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary.

Attending Nazarene Bible College, either as a resident student or as an online student, is another viable option. If attending a Nazarene institution of higher learning is not an option or there are course omissions from work previously completed, the Modular Course of Study will meet the educational requirements for ministry preparation (see the “Educational Preparation” link at [www.nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation](http://www.nazarenepastor.org/clergyeducation)). Students choosing this avenue of preparation are encouraged to complete the Modular Course of Study offered by Northwest Nazarene University and are encouraged to visit the university’s website at <http://www.nnu.edu/cos> or contact Rev. James Rotz at [jhrotz@nnu.edu](mailto:jhrotz@nnu.edu) or 208-467-8371. A college degree is not awarded upon completion of the Modular Course of Study. Course of Study credit may also be received by auditing courses offered by Northwest Nazarene University.

### **5. Reporting Educational Progress**

A primary element of marking the progress of MIDs in their ministerial development is the evaluation of Course of Study requirements completed each year. MIDs enrolled in the online modular course of study must submit a copy of their grade report forms to the MDB Records Coordinator at the Intermountain District Church of the Nazarene by February 15 of each year. Those MIDs enrolled as college, seminary, or Bible college students must request the registrar of their respective institutions to send a transcript to the MDB Records Coordinator also by February 15 of each year.

### **6. Supervised Ministry Experience**

Graduation from the course of study requires the completion of a minimum of 200 hours of field experience. The Intermountain District’s Supervised Ministry Experience Program provides the MID a variety of hands-on ministry experiences. It also serves as a window through which the local Pastor/Staff, district-assigned mentor, and Ministerial Development Board may observe and advise the MID in concrete ministry situations.

The Supervised Ministry Field Experience Program is developed within four quadrants: Observation, Exploration, Experience, and Integration. Each quadrant builds on the previous and intensifies as to the amount of time, effort, and responsibility expected. In each quadrant the student is accountable to and under the supervision of the local Pastor/Staff. Ideally, the MID completes each quadrant on pace with the various other requirements comprising Tiers 1, 2, 3 and 4 respectively. Some MIDs who have been placed in advanced Tiers but have not fulfilled the Supervised Ministry Field Experience quadrants, must still complete the field experience in the correct order. A ministerial student at Northwest Nazarene University or an MID auditing courses through NNU may enroll in PT 171, 296, 396, and 496 to complete the Supervised Ministry Experience (Field Experience) requirement.

A portfolio consisting of learning contracts, journal pages, reflection papers, time-logs, supervisor’s reports and evaluations, and other assigned documents are to be submitted to the Placement Coordinator of the Ministerial Development Board as each quadrant is completed and no later than February 15 of each year.

### **7. Completion of Educational Requirements**

Upon completion of educational requirements, which includes the completion of all aspects of the Supervised Ministry Experience, the MID is awarded graduate status.

## **C. OTHER COMPONENTS OF THE MINISTERIAL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE**

In addition to the educational and Supervised Ministry Experience requirements noted above, the Ministerial Development Initiative also features the following:

### **1. Evaluative Structure**

An individual’s advancement as a Minister in Development (MID) is measured against a series of requirements structured into five tiers. The requirements in each of the five tiers must be met before the MID is placed in the next tier. Requirements for each tier are provided to the student upon enrollment in the District Studies Program.

## **2. MID Assessments**

Each Minister in Development (MID) is required to attend, at the invitation of the Ministerial Development Board, an Initial Assessment and a Mid-Point Assessment. The Initial Assessment is to be attended once during the course of an MID's preparation for ministry and is normally attended by newly-enrolled MIDs or those MIDs recently transferred to the Intermountain District who are early in the process of preparation for ministry. Individuals who have received a district minister's license and who have advanced to Tiers 3 or 4 are required to attend the Mid-Point Assessment. The Mid-Point Assessment is to be attended once only during the course of an MID's preparation for ministry.

## **3. District-Assigned Mentor**

In addition to the Supervised Ministry Experience Program described above, an important summative experience for all MIDs is a 12-month mentoring component. This aspect of the Ministerial Development Initiative is likely to coincide with the period of time when MIDs have entered into roles and responsibilities as assigned ministers and are thus fulfilling the years of service required prior to their becoming eligible to be considered for ordination. The mentoring relationship is designed to connect the MID with someone outside his or her immediate assigned ministry setting who can engage the MID in reflecting on his or her current ministry experience, sharpen ministry skills, and enhance spiritual and personal growth and awareness.

Upon receiving confirmation from the MDB Placement Coordinator of his or her satisfactory completion of the four quadrants of the Supervised Ministry Experience, the MID may apply for a district-assigned mentor (<http://www.intermountaindistrict.org/MIDsFolder.htm>). This assignment is made by the MDB Mentoring Coordinator.

The MID is to meet with the assigned mentor on at least 10 occasions spaced at regular intervals over a 12-month period. The 12-month period begins from the date of the first meeting. The district-assigned mentor is to focus the mentoring in accordance with a mentoring curriculum provided by the Mentoring Coordinator, with due attention to the immediate concerns and growth opportunities of the MID as these become evident as the mentoring relationship progresses. The annual and final reports of the district-assigned mentor and the mentoring experience report of the MID provide important input to the Ministerial Development Board as it monitors and facilitates the continued progress of the MID. At its discretion the Ministerial Development Board may require further mentoring even after an MID has completed the required 12-month district-assigned mentor component.

## **4. Ordination**

Only those MIDs having been placed in Tier 5, having completed the District-Assigned Mentoring component, and having completed the required years of service as an assigned minister (see *Manual* 428-429) or having met the requirements for recognition of ordination in another denomination, shall be eligible to be considered by the Ministerial Development Board for ordination.

Ordination, however, is a privilege and not a right. Therefore, completion of all requirements for ordination does not entitle the MID to be ordained, although all of these requirements must be met in order to be eligible for ordination. The ordination of an MID having fulfilled the requirements for ordination is, therefore, subject to the considered judgment of the Ministerial Development Board as to the MID's readiness for ordination.

## **IV. Daily Proceedings**

### **WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICE**

The District Missional Celebration opened at 7:00 p.m. with music led by Rev. Bob Diehm and the worship team from Boise First Church of the Nazarene. District Superintendent Dr. Stephen Borger welcomed attendees to the District Assembly and extended special greetings to Dr. David Graves, presiding general superintendent, and his wife Sharon; Dr. David Alexander, President of Northwest Nazarene University, and his wife Sandy; Dr. Bob Broadbooks, Mission Director of the USA/Canada Region; and Dr. Stan Reeder, District Superintendent of the Oregon-Pacific District. Dr. Borger led in prayer, and the worship team continued to lead through music.

Dr. Borger provided a financial summary of Pensions & Benefits on the Intermountain District. The District is approximately \$18,000 short of full payment of its Pensions & Benefits obligation for the year ending March 31, 2011. A video related to Pensions & Benefits was shown. Dr. Borger introduced Pensions & Benefits as the special offering for the 2011 Assembly and encouraged the District to support in full this part of Funding the Mission. The offering was received and the worship team continued to lead through music.

Dr. Borger introduced Rick Waitley, District Camp Executive Director. Mr. Waitley introduced the Trinity Pines Staff: Mike and Barb Crevelt, General Managers; Bradley and Kelly Evers, kitchen; Steve and Carol Loder, Facilities Manager and Housekeeping Manager; and Kyra Waitley, Marketing Director. He also introduced Marv and Linda Schmidt, Coordinators of Volunteers; and Grady Harmon, College Coordinator, who will begin serving during the current year's camping season. Camp Directors highlighted the plans for upcoming camps and retreats. Prayer cards, with requests specific to each camp, were distributed to those committed to praying for those camps.

The worship team led again in worship. Dr. Graves delivered the evening message from Luke 13:18-20. He encouraged the congregation to invest wholeheartedly in God's kingdom, believing that God will bring forth a great harvest. Dr. Graves closed in prayer. The worship team led in music. Dr. Borger announced the Assembly schedule and spoke a blessing over the congregation before dismissal.

### **FIRST DAY**

#### **Thursday Morning**

The 99<sup>th</sup> Session of the Intermountain District Assembly opened at Nampa College Church of the Nazarene at 8:30 a.m. on May 12, 2011, with a time of congregational worship in song led by Rev. Bob Diehm (Boise First). Rev. Chuck Hagemeyer extended a welcome on behalf of Nampa College Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Stephen Borger, Intermountain District Superintendent, greeted the Assembly. He introduced presiding General Superintendent Dr. David Graves and his wife Sharon. Dr. Graves greeted the Assembly.

District Secretary Rev. Stan Rodes gave instructions related to the organization of the Assembly. A motion to adopt these arrangements was made, seconded, and passed. Special greetings were extended to Dr. David Alexander (President of Northwest Nazarene University) and his wife Sandy; Dr. Bob Broadbooks (Director of the USA/Canada Mission); Dr. Stan Reeder (District Superintendent of the Oregon-Pacific District); Rev. Jerry Kester (District Superintendent of the Washington-Pacific District); Dr. Jerald Johnson (General Superintendent Emeritus) and his wife Alice; Dr. Ron Kratzer (former Intermountain District Superintendent) and his wife Thelma; Mrs. Ruby Pearsall (wife of the late Dr. Kenneth Pearsall, past president of Northwest Nazarene College); and to Dr. Richard Hagood (the past president of Northwest Nazarene University) and his wife Junella. A motion was made to send special greetings to Dr. Hoyle Thomas (former Intermountain District Superintendent); Mrs. Dorothy Cantrell (wife of former District Superintendent Grady Cantrell); the presidents of Nazarene Theological Seminary and Nazarene Bible College; all missionaries who are members of the Intermountain District; and ordained ministers unable to attend this Assembly due to health concerns. This motion was seconded and carried. Dr. Graves invited Dr. Broadbooks and Dr. Reeder to greet the Assembly. Dr. Broadbooks encouraged the Assembly to continue faithfully in reaching the world for Christ. Dr. Reeder spoke briefly about partnering between districts on common initiatives.

Dr. Graves referred to materials provided by Nazarene Publishing House for pastors and other delegates. A video was shown to highlight the ministry of Nazarene Publishing House. Dr. Graves encouraged the Assembly to utilize the curriculum and other resources available.

A motion to seat alternates was made, seconded, and passed. Partial Report No. 1 of the Ministerial Development Board was presented with the addition of Harold L. Hampton as an Elder receipted

by transfer from the Rocky Mountain District. Partial Report No. 2 of the Ministerial Development Board recommending those to be elected to elder orders was presented. Dr. Graves spoke to the Assembly about ordination. A motion to receive these two reports was made, seconded, and passed. Partial Report No. 3 of the Ministerial Development Board was presented, with the addition of Tarra Schaffer to the list of Minister's Licenses to be renewed. Partial Report No. 4 of the Ministerial Development Board was presented, with two corrections to the written report: Robert L. Minor to be listed as Deacon rather than Elder, and Tarra Schaffer (E) to be added to the list of Licensed Ministers to be continued in Tier 4. A motion to receive these reports as amended was made, seconded, and passed.

Dr. Borger introduced senior pastors in new assignments on the Intermountain District during the past year: Rev. Mark and Glenda Bernhardt (Nampa Karcher), Dr. L. Bryan and Lynette Williams (McCall), Rev. Mouse and Jim McKinney (Enterprise), Revs. John and Tarra Schaffer (Council), Revs. Dustin and Olivia Metcalf (Mountain Home), Rev. Ken and Cheryl Bergstrom (Gooding), and Revs. Mark and Sara Winkelman (Middleton). Dr. Borger also invited lead pastors to introduce associate pastors newly placed in ministries of their churches. Dr. Graves welcomed all of the new pastoral leaders.

Dr. Graves introduced the first Special Order of the Day, the report of District Superintendent Dr. Stephen Borger. Dr. Borger introduced Rev. Chris and Cherie Reiter, and Chris and Camille Rodes. These two couples spoke of their vision and progress in reaching people for Christ in the North Boise area. Dr. Borger led the Assembly in praying for these two families and the ministry they have begun.

Dr. Borger reported on gifts toward the special offering in support of Pensions and Benefits. A DVD was also shown regarding the Centennial Campaign to build a third lodge at Trinity Pines Camp & Conference Center and to pay off all debt for Trinity Pines. He encouraged individuals and churches to provide financial support to these ministries as God leads.

Dr. Borger directed the Assembly to his written report in the delegate booklet and encouraged the delegates to it. Looking toward 2012 as the centennial of the Intermountain District, Dr. Borger outlined his goals for the upcoming year. Dr. Borger then spoke from Colossians 2:6-7 on the theme, "Lifting Up Christ." The calling of the Church is to lift up Christ. This is a distinct, clear, and simple call. It is vital to remain focused on this. Dr. Borger closed in prayer. A motion to receive the report of the District Superintendent was made, seconded, and passed. Dr. Graves presented Dr. and Mrs. Borger to the Assembly and led in expressing appreciation for their service. In behalf of the Intermountain district, Rev. Kent Conrad presented a gift from the District Advisory Board in recognition of the Borger's 40<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary to be celebrated later this month.

Rev. Stan Rodes presented Partial Report No. 1 of the Nominating Committee. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed. Rev. Rodes presented Partial Report No. 2 of the Nominating Committee, noting that the Advisory Board will be presented as a partial report once the NNU trustee elections have been held. Rev. Rodes read and provided clarifying comments. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed. Board of Tellers No. 1 distributed, collected, and counted ballots to elect two ministers and one layperson as Trustees of Northwest Nazarene University, to re-elect Rev. Tim Brewer as Chair of SDMI Board, and to elect one minister and one layperson to the SDMI Board.

Dr. Graves spoke of the significance of Nazarene educational institutions and expressed appreciation for Northwest Nazarene University. Dr. David Alexander, President of NNU, presented the Northwest Nazarene University report. The mission of NNU is the transformation of the whole person. Centered in Jesus Christ, the NNU education instills habits of heart, soul, mind and strength to enable each student to become God's creative and redemptive agent in the world. Dr. Alexander led the Assembly in reciting the University Covenant together. An informational DVD was distributed to senior pastors for use in local churches. Dr. Alexander prayed over the Assembly from the words of Paul in Colossians 1:9-17. Dr. Graves remarked on the report and led the congregation in expressing appreciation for NNU and for Dr. Alexander's leadership.

Dr. Graves called attention to the Education Committee Report, calling attention to opportunities to give and receive support, and to experience the hospitality of Northwest Nazarene University. Dr. Graves called attention also to the reports of the District Superintendent, Camps Board, Nazarene Missions International, Nazarene Youth International, Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International, and Advisory Board. A motion to receive these reports was made, seconded, and passed.

Pastors' reports were presented by John Schaffer (Council), Chuck Ryan (Homedale Mountain View), Bill O'Connor (Marsing), Rod Tegethoff (New Plymouth), Mike Allen (Payette), Tom Cook (Nyssa), and Gary Nelson (Weiser).

Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to elect two ministers and one layperson to the Board of Trustees of Northwest Nazarene University: Ministers – Mike Allen (99), David Fraley (83), Joy Streight (201), and Doug Wilson (173); Layperson – Steve Emerson (97), Julie Sievers (92), and David Slonaker (146). With 332 ballots cast, 167 were needed to elect. Rev. Rodes reported that Joy Streight and Doug Wilson had been elected as Trustees of Northwest Nazarene University; there had not been an election of a layperson as Trustee.

Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to re-elect Rev. Tim Brewer as chair of the District SDMI Board. There were 329 ballots cast, with 328 in favor and 1 opposed. Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to elect members of the District SDMI Board: ministerial – Jeff Doud (150) and Tim Gerdes (177); lay – Karl Gaston (115) and Amber Schwegman (200). Rev. Rodes reported that Tim Brewer had been re-elected as chair of the SDMI Board, and Tim Gerdes (ministerial) and Amber Schwegman (lay) had been elected to the District SDMI Board.

Dr. Graves briefly described a movie titled The Grace Card, and a DVD was shown to the Assembly presenting this film as an outreach tool.

Announcements were made regarding events through the remainder of the day. Dr. Graves closed the morning's business with prayer before adjourning for lunch.

### **Thursday Afternoon**

Dr. David Graves called the afternoon meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. and asked Dr. Borger to lead in the Memoirs service. This began with a video presentation honoring Jarrell Garsee, Hubert Helling, John Lundy, and Donald Mason, elders who passed away during the past year. Dr. Borger invited family members of those four and of those other members of our Intermountain churches who passed away during the past year to the altar, joined also by pastors of those churches, and he led the Assembly in prayer.

Dr. Graves returned the Assembly's attention to Partial Report No. 1 of the Nominating Committee. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed. District Secretary Rev. Stan Rodes read Partial Report No. 3 of the Nominating Committee regarding election of the District Advisory Board. A motion to receive this partial report was made, seconded, and passed.

Dr. Graves called attention to the Christian Action Committee and commented on its key points. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed. The Church Planting and Ministerial Support report was presented. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed.

The second ballot to elect one layperson to the NNU Board of Trustees. Board of Tellers No. 1 distributed, collected, and counted these ballots.

Pastors' reports were presented by Joy Streight (Boise Castle Hills), Dennis Sams (Boise Euclid), Darrel Wiseman (Boise First), Ben Turner (Boise Five Mile), Mark Harmon (Nampa Lakeview), Tim Brewer (Ontario), Jerry Kester (Twin Falls, recently elected as District Superintendent of the Washington-Pacific District), and Mark Winkelman (Middleton).

Instructions were given regarding election of regional ministerial representatives to the District Advisory Board. Board of Tellers No. 2 distributed, collected, and counted these ballots.

Dr. Graves led the Assembly in congratulating Rev. Jerry Kester in his recent election as District Superintendent of the Washington-Pacific District, and expressing appreciation also for his years of service.

Pastors' reports were presented by Matthew Haggard (Boise New Hope), Tim Bunn (Eagle), Eric Seaney (Kuna), Jeff Doud (Emmett), Bryan Williams (McCall), Tim Pusey (Meridian Valley Shepherd), Dustin and Olivia Metcalf (Mountain Home), and Michael Bannon (Vale). Ben and Tami Moore reported on the Crosswalks Ministry at Boise State University.

District Secretary Stan Rodes reported results of the second ballot to elect one layperson to the NNU Board of Trustees: Steve Emerson (70), Julie Sievers (90), and David Slonaker (151). With 321 ballots cast, 161 were needed for election. There was no election on the second ballot. Board of Tellers No. 1 distributed and collected the third ballot to elect a layperson to the NNU Board of Trustees.

Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to elect ministerial representatives from each region to the District Advisory Board, with 321 ballots cast: West – Michael Allen (112), Tim Gerdes (99), and Jonathan Privett (109); East – Michael Seward (120), Robert Sherwood (86), and Sheryl Tedder (115); Central – Randy Bynum (76), Kent Conrad (140), Johnny Hampton (29), and Tim Pusey (73). Rev. Rodes reported that Michael Allen (West), Michael Seward (East), and Kent Conrad (Central) had been elected as regional lay representatives for the District Advisory Board. Board of Tellers No. 2 distributed and collected ballots

to elect at-large ministerial members to the District Advisory Board. Both Boards of Tellers were dismissed to count ballots.

Rev. Rich Vasquez and Rev. Aaron Larson presented an update regarding Nazarene Youth Conference in July 2011, including the impact it has on those involved and on the community of Louisville, Kentucky. A DVD was shown to highlight the NYC theme of "A World Unbroken."

Announcements were made regarding organizational details of the Assembly and the evening's ordination service. Dr. Borger reported that an additional \$1,500 had been pledged for Pensions and Benefits. Dr. Graves closed in prayer as the Assembly adjourned at 4:30 p.m. until the evening's ordination service.

### **Thursday Evening Ordination Service**

District Superintendent Dr. Stephen Borger opened the ordination service at 7:00 p.m. Prelude music was provided by Cindy Rodes and Rev. Matthew Haggard (Boise New Hope). Rev. Bob Diehm (Boise First Church) led the congregation in singing "Holiness Unto the Lord" as the ordinands entered, accompanied by their spouses. General Superintendent Dr. David Graves invited clergy and laity to honor the ordination time and the sacred moment that this service represents in being called by God to serve the needs of mankind, then led in prayer.

Rev. Joy Streight (Boise Castle Hills) read Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-16. Rev. Diehm led the congregation in singing "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling." The congregation read together The Apostles' Creed led by Dr. Borger.

Dr. Borger acknowledged the retirement of three of our ministers, with regrets that none could be in attendance at the Assembly. Dr. Borger asked all chaplains to stand for recognition and expressed appreciation to them for their service to the church.

Dr. Borger asked those receiving their first district minister's license to stand as he read the charge to the newly-licensed ministers. Those being recognized included: Rachel Brewer, Scott Carver, Matthew Hulen, Savannah Johnson, Brian Loeber, Jayson Martindale, Shaun Mattson, Timothy Meeks, Kristen Parke, Robert Post Jr., Joshua Potter and Timothy Streight. Dr. Borger prayed a prayer of dedication for the newly-licensed ministers.

District Secretary Stan Rodes presented ordinands Libby Jean Gerdes, Karen Elizabeth Jones, Debi Diane Schmelzenbach, and Casey Lee Wilkerson to Dr. Graves as individuals examined and approved for ordination by their local congregations, the District Ministerial Development Board, and the District Assembly. Dr. Graves addressed the ordinands regarding their call to ministry. The ordinands affirmed their agreement to the foundational beliefs of the Church of the Nazarene, their commitment to ministry, and their commitment to personally nurture growth in relationship with God in their own lives. Dr. Graves asked spouses to stand and addressed their role in being partners in ministry that they share with those being ordained. Dr. Graves expressed the desire of God's blessing on the spouses as they continue their commitment and involvement in the ministry.

A choir of ordained ministers was invited to the platform. The choir sang "And Can It Be," directed by Rev. Bob Diehm. Rev. Tim Pusey (Meridian Valley Shepherd) read aloud Nazarene *Manual* paragraphs 401.1- 401.6 regarding the call and qualifications of a minister. Rev. Paul Ellis (Meridian Valley Shepherd) sang "I Will Not Forget Thee" accompanied by Rev. Bob Diehm.

Dr. Graves brought the ordination message from Colossians 1:25-29. The title of the sermon was "The Great Secret." Dr. Graves challenged the congregation to their role in being passionate for the lost. Dr. Graves closed the message with prayer.

Ordained ministers were invited to the platform. Ordinands knelt at the altar with their spouses during the ordination ceremony. Ordained ministers were invited to gather around those kneeling as Dr. Graves ordained them. Prayers of consecration were offered by mentors selected by the ordinands. Libby Jean Gerdes, Debi Diane Schmelzenbach, Casey Lee Wilkerson, and Karen Elizabeth Jones were all ordained elders in the Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Graves presented each newly ordained minister their credentials and spoke words of blessing over each. The congregation responded with applause in congratulating the class of new elders.

Dr. David Alexander, President of Northwest Nazarene University, presented to each newly ordained minister a Scott Stearman sculpture entitled "The Calling" on behalf of the University as a symbol of their call to be fishers of men.

Dr. Graves closed the service in prayer and then led the recessional of new ordinands to the

reception area. The recessional "A Charge to Keep I Have" was played as the ministers departed the sanctuary followed by the congregation. The Assembly was dismissed with the opportunity to continue the celebration at a reception honoring the ordinands.

## **SECOND DAY**

### **Friday Morning**

The morning session opened with congregational worship in song and prayer led by Rev. Bob Diehm (Boise First). General Superintendent Dr. David Graves greeted the Assembly as business began.

District Secretary Rev. Stan Rodes reported results of the third ballot to elect one layperson to the NNU Board of Trustees: Steve Emerson (36), Julie Sievers (62), and David Slonaker (212). With 310 ballots cast, 156 were needed for election. Dr. Graves reported that David Slonaker had been elected as lay representative to the NNU Board of Trustees.

Pastors' reports were presented by Perry Arbogast (Elko), Bob Sherwood (Idaho Falls), Joel Gay (Layton Rosewood Lane), Scott Sampson (Pocatello Rocky Mountain Ministries), Fred and Sheryl Tedder (Salt Lake City First), Grantley Martelly (Salt Lake City Impact), and Jerry Hampton (Parma).

Dr. Graves called attention to the report of the Church Properties Board. A motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed.

Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to elect two at-large ministerial members to the District Advisory Board: Randy Bynum (98), Tim Gerdes (75), Johnny Hampton (35), Jonathan Privett (92), Tim Pusey (165), Robert Sherwood (52), and Sheryl Tedder (98). Rev. Rodes reported that Tim Pusey had been elected as an at-large ministerial member of the District Advisory Board. Board of Tellers No. 2 distributed, collected, and counted ballots to elect the final at-large ministerial member of the District Advisory Board.

Pastors' reports were presented by Mouse McKinney (Enterprise), Jonathan Privett (Baker City), Ben Vavold (Harney County), Lee Tiller (Harper), Dan Wiese (John Day), Tim Gerdes (La Grande), and Ron Hunter (New Bridge). Unable to attend, Fred Laeger (Elgin) submitted a written report.

Dr. Graves called attention to the Treasurer's report. District Treasurer Lowell Rowley presented highlights of the written report. Motion to receive this report was made, seconded, as passed. Dr. Graves called attention to the Auditing Committee Report, noting that the District Advisory Board has examined the audit report in full. Motion to receive was made, seconded, and passed. Dr. Graves called attention to the Finance Committee Report. Joel Pearsall, Chair of the Finance Committee, presented highlights of the written report. Motion to receive this report was made, seconded, and passed. Rev. Rodes expressed appreciation to pastors and treasurers in timely reporting and remittances in finance and offered continuing assistance as needed in understanding and implementing the apportionments system adopted the previous year.

Rev. Rodes reported results of the vote to elect the remaining at-large ministerial member of the District Advisory Board, with 309 ballots cast: Randy Bynum (179) and Sheryl Tedder (130). Dr. Graves reported that Randy Bynum had been elected as an at-large ministerial member of the District Advisory Board.

Pastors' reports were presented by Ryan and Becca Notbohm (Filer), Ken Bergstrom (Gooding Desert Hills), Mike Seward (Kimberly), David Fraley (Caldwell Canyon Hill), Brian Dyer (Caldwell Ustick Road), Doug Wilson (Nampa Bethel), Daryl Johnson (Nampa College), Jim Lester (Nampa Fairview, transitional pastor), Kent Conrad (Nampa First), Mark Bernhardt (Nampa Karcher), Dana Hicks (Nampa Real Life), and Randy Bynum (Nampa Vida Nueva). Dr. Graves led in expressing appreciation to pastors for their reports, and to retired pastors present in the Assembly.

The report of the Committee on Daily Journal was reviewed. A motion to adopt this report was made, seconded, and passed. Announcements were made, and appreciation expressed for the hospitality and service of all involved in hosting and leading the annual Assembly.

Dr. Graves preached a message of "Holiness without Exceptions" from Colossians 3:10. God's intent is that His people be made holy, transformed into His likeness. This requires a conscious decision to pursue a life of holiness; complete denial of the old self; and consistent discipline. The new self is marked by new fruit (Galatians 5:22-23), new fragrance (2 Corinthians 2:14-15), and a new face (2 Corinthians 3:18). Dr. Graves challenged the Assembly to live a life of holiness without exceptions, and he closed in prayer.

A motion to adjourn the 99<sup>th</sup> District Assembly was made, seconded, and passed, and the Assembly adjourned at 11:50 a.m. on May 13, 2011.

This proved to be the best offering that we have had for awhile, a little over \$400 . . . praise God! Everyone got involved in seeing who would win, the adults or the kids/teens. It was a fun way to take an offering and it was time for a little change.” - Leslie Perry, NMI President

- **From Homedale Mt. View:** “We had Natalia Skala from Ukraine . . . our offering for her was over \$3,800. This was enough to heat the new orphanage for a full year.” – Eula Dunn NMI President.
- **From Kuna:** “Pastry Cupboard – bread and other food distributed on Thursday evenings to needy Kuna citizens. Warm winter clothing collected and delivered to the Boise Rescue Mission. Support for our Haiti WW trip (June 2011) with money raising efforts.” – Jeanie Seaney, NMI President
- **From Boise Five Mile:** “Each February for about nine years, we have a popular event called ‘Open Mic for Missions.’ The congregation pledges money if ‘so and so’ will sing, play an instrument, give a reading, etc. Homemade pies and other items are auctioned off .... And all monies go to the WEF fund. The evening finishes with pie and ice cream. This year we had our most successful event ever with \$1,500 raised.” - Elise Kull, NMI President
- **From Nampa First:** “Faith Promise 2011 was an exciting weekend with Rev. Carla Sunberg. We held an all-church breakfast and then delivered baked goods and flowers to many homes, did yard work and washed windows as a ministry to others. Provided a *Missions Update* hand-out on a monthly basis for the congregation. Sent out a weekly letter to a Missions Prayer Team.” - Mary Winkle, NMI President
- **From Caldwell Canyon Hill:** “We combined our resources with Nyssa to send a WW team to Ecuador.” - Charlotte Bass, NMI President
- **From Boise Euclid:** “We sent a WW team of 7 teens and 6 adults to the Sun Valley Indian School in Arizona in August 2010.” - Colleen Andrew, NMI President
- **From Salt Lake City First:** Summer Reading Contest, “Bananas for Books”, kids vs. teens vs. adults with a banana split reward party at the end of the summer. Participated in WEF Plus offering using a quarter jug challenging each person to give a quarter each week leading up to Thanksgiving.” - Karen Horwood, NMI President
- **From Valley Shepherd:** “. . . We gathered materials to assemble 72 Crisis Care Kits. Josh used “SKYPE” to enable us to see and communicate directly with our missionary on the field.” - Mark Anderson, NMI President

I’m sure all of your churches have accomplished much in this last year. I know that we will continue to be a strong, mission-minded District, serving the Lord more effectively in our State, our Nation, and around the World.

### 4. Camps Board

The week following District Assembly 2010, we had one of our largest Trinity Pines Work Weeks in the history of our time at the Cascade location. Young and mature, men and women, families, and hundreds of volunteer hours of labor helped to prepare the camp for the big event.

Finally, Sunday June 6 arrived and we celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Trinity Pines. Special music, a Celebration Worship Service with Dr. Borger preaching, tours, camp food, and a balloon release led by former Idaho First Lady Patricia Kempthorne followed by a cake reception brought hundreds of people to Cascade. What a blessing to see what God had accomplished in just ten short years.

In the summer of 2010 we opened the Stake Garden located just outside the west doors of the Conference Center. Campers of all ages were encouraged to drive down a stake with their name and date displayed as to when they made their commitment to the Lord. The white stakes driven into the hillside are an inspiration to the changed lives of campers from the summer camp season.

Building projects continued at Trinity Pines. Work was started on Lodge #3 in Elk Valley, a new bell tower located near the Conference Center, and additional improvements made in the amphitheater. Hundreds of volunteer hours were recorded throughout the summer months from individuals and couples who diligently gave of their time to Trinity Pines.

In September, Share the Dream IV was held at the Nampa Civic Center. Testimonies, interviews with Directors, and reports on financial progress and building projects were highlights of the evening. The goal of \$80,000 was set before those in attendance to include \$5,000 for camper scholarships and \$75,000 for operational support. The Celebration Cake was rolled in and a report was given on the debt reduction based upon faithful support in celebrating birthdays, anniversaries, and special events.

Trinity Pines continues to enjoy a dedicated staff who minister to the needs of those who visit. On-site Managers Mike and Barb Crevelt and their family, along with Office Manager Lynn Rosbrugh, Facilities and Maintenance Steve Loder, Housekeeping Carol Loder, Food Service Pam Morehouse and Marketing Director Kyra Waitley were there to serve those who visited Trinity Pines.

In the fall the Board made the decision to hire a Chef to head our Food Service Department. Chef Bradley Evers from Canby, OR brought a whole new dimension to the retreat and camp food we serve. Chef Brad and his wife Kelly (the baker in the kitchen) arrived around Thanksgiving to make their home in Cascade. Many thanks to Pam Morehouse for her leadership in the camp food service program over the past few years. Pam's dedication and hard work helped us grow our food service program and Pam is responsible for many of the improvements made in meeting the nutritional needs of our campers. Thanks, Pam, for being a servant in the Lord's work.

Despite the difficult economic times, we saw an increased number of campers attending District sponsored camps in the summer of 2010. We feel the marketing efforts are paying off as we have new rentals and increased exposure to churches and new families on our District.

## C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

### 1. Finance Committee

We thank God for His generous blessings upon the Intermountain District. We also commend the people of our district for their faithful stewardship. The consistent support of pastors and laypersons alike is essential to "**Funding the Mission**" of the Church of the Nazarene at home and abroad.

Desiring to maximize the usefulness of our district resources, we recommend the following:

1. That the churches of the Intermountain District follow the allocation formula approved and recommended by the General Board and the Board of General Superintendents of the Church of the Nazarene which is as follows:

"Each local church shall share in Funding the Mission of the International Church of the Nazarene based on giving a percentage of Total Giving Income minus the amount given for WEF [World Evangelism Fund] and Approved Mission Specials. The percentage allocation is: 5.5%-WEF, 2%-P&B, 2.5%-Education (NNU), and each district shall set their own allocation percentage."

2. **Therefore**, the Intermountain District allocation formula shall be based on the following percentages of Total Giving Income (APR Line 30) minus the amount contributed and sent in for World Evangelism Fund [WEF] (APR Line 31) and Approved Mission Specials (APR Line 32):

World Evangelism Fund.....	5.5%

District.....	3.5%

3. That all budgets payments for the prior month be remitted by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month.

4. That each church pay all budgets in full and strive to achieve Mission Ten status.
5. That all District financial records be audited annually, with the procedures and details to be arranged by the District Advisory Board.

### **4. Nominations Committee**

#### *Partial Report No. 1*

We recommend that the following be adopted by acclamation:

District Assembly Finance Committee—We recommend that the 2011 District Assembly Finance Committee be comprised of the members of the Advisory Board plus an equal number of ministers and laypersons. (The district superintendent and district treasurer are members *ex-officio* per *Manual* 203.21.) Accordingly, we recommend the following: ministers—Timothy Brewer, Matthew Haggard, Olivia Metcalf, Gary Nelson, Stan Rodes, Eric Seaney, Joy Streight, Richard Vasquez; laypersons—Holly Davis, Gary Evans, Carolita Fraley, Gerron Gibson, Pete Nichols, Julie Sievers, Rich Waitley, Rick Youngblood.

Camps Board—We recommend that the Camps Board be comprised of ten members, both pastors and laypersons, in good standing on the district. Of the ten members, a minimum of four members must come from each category (pastor/layperson). Board members will serve a term of three years. Accordingly, in addition to those currently serving through 2012 and 2013, we recommend the following to serve through 2014: ministers—Tim Pusey, Eric Seaney; laypersons—Bob Bullock, Jeff Hibbard. We further recommend that the following minister fill the remainder of the term vacated by Don Renschler and serve through 2013—Dustin Metcalf.

#### *Partial Report No. 2*

We recommend elective ballots for the following offices:

Trustees, Northwest Nazarene University—For the election of two (2) ministers and one (1) layperson to serve for a term of three (3) years, we nominate the following: ministers—Michael Allen, David Fraley, Joy Streight, Doug Wilson; laypersons—Steve Emerson Julie Sievers, David Slonaker. We recommend the election be by majority vote and, if there is not an election after the third ballot, the ballot be reduced to twice the number to elect.

Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) Board—For the election of a chairman to serve for a term of two (2) years, we recommend the following: Tim Brewer. For the election of one (1) minister and one (1) layperson to serve for a term of three (3) years, we nominate the following: ministers—Jeff Doud, Tim Gerdes; laypersons—Karl Gaston, Amber Schwegman.

#### *Partial Report No. 3*

Advisory Board—The Intermountain District Advisory Board is divided into three (3) Election Regions: Central (C) — churches in the E. and W. Treasure Valley Mission Areas; East (E) — churches in the Magic Valley and E. Idaho/Nevada/Utah Mission Areas; West (W) — churches in the E. Oregon and Snake River Mission Areas

With a district membership of 11,635 we are eligible to have ten (10) members on the Advisory Board (*Manual* 221). Accordingly, we recommend that the Advisory Board be comprised of five (5)

ministers and five (5) laypersons to serve terms of two (2) years, with the Assembly alternating each year its election of lay and ministerial members. We also recommend that at least one (1) person from each Election Region be elected.

## 6. Christian Action Committee

As Christ’s Church we have an extraordinary opportunity and responsibility to demonstrate the vitality of our faith in the areas of home, work, recreation, and worship. We must encourage believers in Christ to think and behave like our Lord. The Gospel determines our moral action and informs our ethic. Therefore, we recommend the following statements:

1. **PRINCIPLES OF CHRISTIAN LIVING** - We recommend that we keep before our people the principles as set forth in “The Covenant of Christian Character” (*Manual 27-27.3, 903.1-903.19*). We further

recommend these Manual statements be printed and distributed periodically throughout the year.

2. **CHRISTIAN FAMILY** - Recognizing that a strong America is dependent upon strong churches and strong families, we emphasize the importance of Christian family life. We caution our people to beware of and to resist efforts to redefine the family in terms that violate the biblical concept of the sanctity of marriage between one man and one woman (*Manual* 35-37). We agree that ministers of the Church of the Nazarene give due care to matters relating to solemnizing marriages (*Manual* 35.2). Solemnization of marriage is all inclusive: the sacred ceremony, the license, the filing of the license, and the person performing the ceremony certifying that the persons involved were legally joined in matrimony. We recommend that each family spend time praying, reading the Word, and worshiping together. We also suggest that each church evaluate its calendar and programs to assure that church activities are planned to be “family friendly.” Our pastors and people are also encouraged to aggressively respond to the needs of single-parent families.

3. **MORAL VALUES** - We appeal to our local and district leaders and pastors to give strong emphasis in our Christian Education curriculum and from our pulpits to such basic biblical truths as will develop the sense of discernment and discrimination between good and evil.

4. **MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY** - We recognize that the media and contemporary technology is a powerful communication tool. In light of victimization of children and the merchandising of immoral products through the Internet, it is imperative that technology, social networks, and all forms of popular media be continually scrutinized and evaluated. Parents and leaders in our churches should take all possible means to educate and protect children from pedophiles and all others who would prey on them. We all should guard our eyes and hearts from that which will defile, destroy, or hinder our inheriting the kingdom of God. We commend those who sponsor the good and let our voices be heard against the unacceptable.

5. **COMMENDATIONS AND CONCERNS** - We encourage our people to express appreciation to individuals, elected officials, media, and other organizations who support values consistent with biblical standards in society. We also pray for and express concern to those who oppose such values. Knowing all that is necessary for evil to prevail is for good persons to do nothing, we strongly urge that our local churches seek to involve their people in forms of ministry that will model our biblical standards of morality to the communities in which they live.

6. **GAMBLING** - Gambling (legalized lotteries included) has gained an unparalleled foothold these past years. Gambling is addictive in nature, potentially inflicting or increasing poverty in the lives of those who participate and their dependents. Gambling undermines personal trust in God and our responsibility to work faithfully (1 Thessalonians 4:11-12). We appeal to each church to oppose gambling and legalized lotteries.

7. **COMPASSIONATE MINISTRY** - Our people must always be concerned about the needy of our communities. By providing food, clothing, and shelter, we can continue in the footsteps of our founding fathers — that is, taking the Gospel to the hurting. We encourage our people to support faith-based and community initiatives which care for the less fortunate and to foster social services available in their area that develop compassionate community partnerships.

8. **LORD'S DAY SANCTITY** - We urge that the Lord's Day continue to be observed as “. . . a day wholly unto the Lord,” set aside for the worship of God and the recuperation of our bodies. We urge Christians to avoid participation in any activity that would take away from the sanctity of the Lord's Day.

9. **HOMOSEXUALITY** - We urge our people, in observance of biblical truth, to oppose the popular assumption that homosexual and lesbian behaviors are normal and acceptable. We recommend that political, business, media, and entertainment organizations which favor and/or glorify this immoral and destructive behavior be rejected. We further request the Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries of the General Church develop a curriculum objectively addressing the benefits of obedience to the biblical standard of moral conduct, emphasizing the known disintegrating results inherent in homosexual activity, and encouraging the church to act in a redemptive manner by praying and believing that God can transform

any and every individual.

10. **NON-DISCRIMINATION** - Recognizing the biblical standard of reaching out to all people regardless of race, color, class, language, status, gender or ethnicity, we encourage our churches to take deliberate and intentional steps to reach out to and include all peoples in our congregations and ministries. We stand opposed to any attempts to segregate people by race, color, class, language, or ethnic group.

11. **CREATION** - The Church of the Nazarene believes in the biblical account of creation. We oppose any godless interpretation of the origin of the universe and of humankind. We firmly believe that God is the Creator.

12. **SANCITY OF HUMAN LIFE** - We believe in the sanctity of human life and must unite to protect against abortion and embryonic stem cell research that requires the destruction of the human embryo. We ought also to protect against all efforts to legalize euthanasia and against the withholding of reasonable medical care to the handicapped, the terminally ill, or the elderly. Life is a gift from God. All human life, including life developing in the womb, is created by God in His image and is, therefore, to be nurtured, supported, and protected from the moment of conception. We oppose induced abortion by any means when used for either personal convenience or population control (*Manual* 36).

We further recommend that each local church board establish a Christian Action Committee of no less than three persons who will report to the board semi-annually actions taken to implement the statements of the adopted report of the District Christian Action Committee and to provide information to the local church that will assist in stimulating a Christian response to the social issues of our times.

Recognizing that a holy life begins within and realizing that the keen edge of spiritual living can be dulled, it is imperative that we think and behave like the redeemed people of God that we are. Our final admonition comes from the pen of Paul who sums up the intent of this report: "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things" (Philippians 4:8).

It should be noted that the District Assembly is not a legislative body and therefore recommends the delegation refer to the Church of the Nazarene *Manual* 2009-2013 for current actions on social issues (Manuals are available from Nazarene Publishing House). If discussion of this report is desired, appointments with the District Advisory Board can be considered through the Intermountain District Office.

## 7. Education

Recognizing the mutual value of the century long partnership between the churches of the Intermountain District of the Church of the Nazarene and Northwest Nazarene University (NNU) for the training and development of Christian leaders in the Wesleyan tradition and providing Christian-based higher education for people in the Northwest, the Committee on Education solicits pastors and laypersons to give cooperation, support, and prayers for Northwest Nazarene University, Nazarene Theological Seminary, and Nazarene Bible College.

We recommend the following:

1. That people in our churches pursuing higher education be encouraged to consider NNU for their education needs. Prospective students are encouraged to contact Carly Bartlett or Elpidia Allen at 208-467-8000 or 1-877-NNU-4-YOU (transfer students are encouraged to contact Anna Lee) for admission and financial aid information.

2. That every church of the district strive to pay its education goal in full and take advantage of the Trustees Matching Award Program to make more funds available for their students who attend NNU. The matching rate for 2011-2012 is:

We commend all churches that are involved in the matching program and encourage them to give above the \$350 matching amount to students attending NNU. We further recommend that local churches, with the prompting of the university, see that the awards be announced at high school graduations or award assemblies as well as in worship services.

3. That the alumni and friends of the university promote the work of NNU by praying for the university, recruiting students, and giving to University Scholarship Funds. These groups can work with Tahmina Martelly (telephone: 801-265-3403 or email: tahminam@msn.com) or Hollie Lindner (telephone: 208-467-8511 or email: hmlindner@nnu.edu), the NNU Alumni Representatives for the Intermountain District.

4. That every church be strongly encouraged to participate in raising funds for endowed scholarships (including the Ministerial Scholarship Program) to provide greater financial support and reduce the net education cost to our students who attend NNU.

5. That our people be encouraged to invest in the work of NNU through charitable gift annuities, charitable trusts, and by placing NNU in their last wills and testaments. Donors should be encouraged to give to the General Endowment Fund or the unrestricted University Fund.

6. That Idaho residents in our churches be made aware of the benefits of state income tax credits available when giving to NNU.

7. That each local church cooperate with the university in the following ways:

a. Assist with recruiting prospective students.

(1) Encourage all senior high school students to participate in and send all high school juniors and seniors to one of the Explore NNU or Friday Escape events held at various times throughout the year at NNU.

(2) Maintain a supply of literature about the university.

(3) See that the Admissions Office of the university receives the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of the local junior and senior high church youth and other potential college students.

(4) Publicly acknowledge in a worship service all students receiving matching awards from NNU.

b. Remember its college students in prayer and give special attention to all missionary and international students.

c. Promote NNU by a positive attitude, allowing university groups to hold services.

d. Open the church schedule to the ministries of students, faculty, and staff to be a resource for needs of local churches.

e. Enter into partnership with the university by encouraging Work & Witness type teams from the local church to assist the university in special projects.

f. Encourage support of the NNU Volunteer Association whose members give staff support to various needs of the university.

g. Observe Nazarene University Day, which is scheduled for October 2, 2011.

h. Cooperate with, support, and pray for the Ministerial Scholarship program and participating students.

8. That all new pastors and associates who have never visited the campus of NNU be encouraged to do so as soon as possible. The university will provide lodging and meals for new pastors who are visiting NNU. For more information, contact Rev. Fred Fullerton, Vice President for Spiritual and Leadership Development, at 208-467-8530.

9. That each local congregation consider providing a budget line item for pastoral continuing education.

10. That the Intermountain District churches continue to pray for and participate in the annual offerings for Nazarene Theological Seminary and Nazarene Bible College.

11. That pastors and families of Nazarene students attending other colleges notify pastors in the college community so that they may give spiritual support to these young people.

12. That, as NNU desires to promote itself on the local church level, each church provide promotional time and space to the university and its representatives in services and in common meeting areas of the church.

13. That each local congregation appoint an NNU Church Representative who will:

- a. Accept responsibility for receiving and distributing communications from the university.
- b. Work in conjunction with the pastor/pastoral staff to see that this information gets to the various departments of the church.

14. That, in addition to University Day, each local church body coordinate and facilitate with NNU an "NNU Church Invasion Day" Sunday morning program.

15. That each church supports its local and the District Nazarene Youth International (NYI) by facilitating and encouraging participation in "Main Event" held each spring by NYI on the campus of NNU.

### **8. Church Planting and Ministerial Support**

Believing that it is the sacred duty and goal of each church to support its pastor so that the pastor may devote full time to the work of the ministry, the Committee on Church Planting and Ministerial Support recommends:

1. That the church family provide its pastoral family with a solid base of prayer support, encouragement, and understanding upon which can be built an effective ministry.

2. That regular attention be given to adequate financial provisions for the pastor and family. Items in the financial package should include:

- a. Salary: A minimum of \$2,000 per month be considered as a base for self-supporting churches. Salary supplement through the District Church Support budget may be recommended by the District Superintendent and approved by the District Advisory Board on a case-by-case basis. Salary reviews should be made annually.
- b. Housing: A parsonage, including all utilities, improvements, and maintenance costs, or a comparable cash housing allowance. Regular attention should be given by the church board to parsonage care and improvement.
- c. Health Insurance: Every church is to pay the premiums for insurance coverage for its pastoral family or families. The only exceptions are those churches under temporary Church Planting assistance. Such protection is of vital importance, both to the church and its pastor(s).
- d. Social Security: Participation in the Social Security program is mandatory for Nazarene ministers and requires them to pay the tax on a quarterly basis at the rate of 15.30%, figured on salary and the value of provided housing. Reimbursement by the church to the pastor for the net full amount paid by the pastor is recommended.

3. Each church is to have a Pastoral Care Committee. Its function is to provide recognition for the pastors and their families on special occasions (Thanksgiving, Christmas, birthdays, anniversaries, etc.) with a gift/cash and, when appropriate, a celebration.

4. That each church establish an Accountable Reimbursement Plan with its pastoral staff in accordance with the current I.R.S. Code in order to provide for the reimbursement of out-of-pocket ministry expenses including the costs of operation of personal vehicles used in church work, church-related entertainment, professional enrichment, district meetings, and continuing education not otherwise provided for by the church.

5. That the church board give serious consideration to retirement planning for its ministers. Regular deposits of any amount into a tax-sheltered annuity or other retirement plan offered by the general church is one logical approach. Payment in full of the Pensions & Benefits goal is also vital.

6. That our churches encourage personal renewal for their pastoral families through:

- a. Regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation.
- b. Vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:

- (1) Two weeks (14 calendar days, including 2 Sundays) for pastors who have served in the denomination up to 5 years.
  - (2) Three weeks (21 calendar days, including 3 Sundays) for pastors serving the denomination from 6 to 15 years.
  - (3) Four weeks (28 calendar days, including 4 Sundays) for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years.
- c. Provisions of at least one week each year for study and improvement apart from church functions and vacations, with a report being given to the church board regarding the week's activities and actual expenses being reimbursed to the pastor.
7. That we continue the practice, particularly at Christmas time, of the larger churches sponsoring smaller church pastoral families for special care. This process is coordinated through the district office.
  8. That we be reminded that the objective of each local church is to become fully self-supporting, including adequate care for our pastoral families. Salary supplements from the Church Support fund and from other district sources should be considered as temporary assistance while full local support is being developed. No church should expect such assistance for more than two years. After a church has received support for one year, it should present a plan to the Advisory Board for removing itself from assistance.
  9. That financial care of commissioned evangelists serving our churches include:
    - a. Salary for each week of service to the local church at the rate of at least twice the pastor's weekly salary. A meeting held over two Sundays should be considered as equivalent to two weeks. The reimbursement of travel, lodging, and other expense should be additional.
    - b. Consideration given to group insurance coverage provided for commissioned evangelists by the local church where membership is held.
  10. Since we believe that adequate support for ministerial personnel will relieve personal pressures, thereby resulting in more effective leadership and direction for Kingdom growth, we recommend that a copy of this report be provided to each church board secretary and read or distributed to each local church board at the first church board meeting following the district assembly.

#### **Retirement Benefits**

1. Each local church should review regularly the impact of current tax law as it relates to estate and retirement planning. Qualified independent counsel should be sought.
2. The denomination's retirement plan will place \$500 into the pastor's retirement 403(b) account for the current year. We urge churches to match this amount as a bare minimum. Churches that are able should increase that amount as much as possible. Special attention should be given if the pastor resides in a church-owned parsonage.
3. Full payment of the Pensions & Benefits goal by the church will result in an additional annual deposit of \$500.
4. Basic Life Insurance is provided for every qualified minister in the amount of \$15,000 in life insurance coverage and \$1,000 of spousal life insurance coverage at no cost. This benefit is made possible through the faithful giving by churches and districts to the Nazarene Pensions and Benefits USA Fund. To qualify the minister must be an active, full-time and full-livelihood *ordained minister, district-licensed minister, or district-credentialed lay person* who is an employee of a Nazarene church or a Nazarene church agency on a U.S. district that pays into the Pensions and Benefits Fund, who is younger than age 70½, and who is not receiving a retirement benefit from the Basic Pension Plan portion of the Single Defined Benefit Plan.

#### **Sabbatical Leave Guidelines**

*Sabbatical Defined:* An extended time away from routine ministry for the purpose of renewal, retooling, and fresh visioning.

*For Senior Pastors:* After six (6) years of full-time ministry in the same local church, a sabbatical of up to six (6) weeks could be granted to take place in year seven (7). This time can be taken in successive weeks or in less extensive increments, *as the senior pastor and the church board agree and in consultation with the district superintendent (Manual 129.10).*

*For Pastoral Staff:* The granting of sabbaticals for pastoral staff members may be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by their senior pastor and local church board, and in consultation with the district superintendent.

*Local Church Responsibilities:* To extend full compensation and benefits to the pastor during the sabbatical and provide interim ministry and a love offering to assist in travel and other expenses for the pastor.

*Pastor's Responsibilities:* (1) To present a sabbatical plan to the church board for input and approval; (2) to provide a contact source, if needed; (3) to share the highlights of the sabbatical with the church upon completion; (4) to submit a brief written report to the district superintendent.

*Important Sabbatical Preparations:* (1) Lines of authority while pastor is gone; (2) pastor's responsibilities cared for; (3) procedures for dealing with any crisis (conflicts, counseling, etc.); (4) if interim pastor is brought in, a love offering given when assignment is completed.

*Suggested Questions to Interact with in Planning for a Sabbatical:* (1) What are the risks? (2) What are the advantages? (3) What are our mutual goals and expectations for the sabbatical? (4) What methods of communication will be in place regarding the sabbatical?

*Examples of Sabbaticals:* (1) continuing education at an accredited institution (NNU would provide a cost-effective program); (2) traveling sabbatical to visit other churches and get some fresh ideas; (3) a mountain retreat area where prayer and a planned reading program could take place; (4) attendance at various short-term seminars in area(s) of need; (5) a trip in the U.S. or abroad to a spiritual renewal center; (6) short-term cross-cultural ministry; (7) mini-sabbaticals, such as those offered by NNU, for churches where this would be an unreasonable financial impact. NNU provides the use of their library, chapel programs, and free housing (as space is available).
